What does SEN mean?

- Schools have a legal requirement to record and track interventions which run in school. SEN status can be given to some children who are receiving additional learning outside of the regular school offer.
- SEN means that the class teacher/SENCo/School have identified that a child needs additional support.
- SEN is not a diagnosis; however, if the SEN is not being met by school intervention it may be that this can lead to referrals for a diagnosis.
- SEN is not permanent as it could be that through intervention the child's need is met and does not require additional support.

How can SEN be supported in school?



- If your child is on the SEN register, your child will have an education plan which breaks down their area of need into targets. You will be invited by the class teacher to review these targets each term.
- The plan follows the Graduated Approach method which is outlined in our SEND Policy available on the school website.

- SEN support may be subject based interventions, play-time support plans, therapeutic interventions or physical sensory resources. SEN support is individualised to the needs of the child.



Parent involvement in SEN

- If you have any concerns regarding your child's needs in school or at home, it is important to reach out to the school either through the class teacher or school SENCo so we can support you and your child through necessary steps.
- How to raise a concern or ask questions:
 - Use the home school diary to arrange a meeting with the class teacher.
 - Email the main school office who will put you in touch with your child's teacher. enquiries@barrscourtps.org.uk
 - Email the school SENCo who will be able to help set up appropriate next steps. sendco@barrscourtps.org.uk

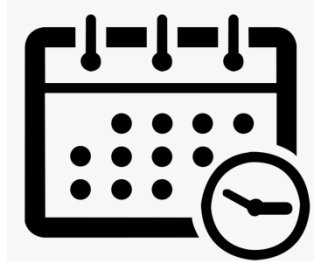
