Before I start this match report, I must admit that the game went by in a blur for me so if I misremember any details, I do apologise!

The team had spent the day enjoying the experience and turned up to the match "suited and booted" in their team coach (thank you to those that organised this) and with the changing rooms all laid out ready for them. As both teams entered the pitch, the roar of the crowd heightened the atmosphere.

Barrs Court started quickly, scoring an opening goal after 69 seconds! The team maintained the high tempo and a second quickly followed. St Anne's were not finished though and fought their way back into the game, scoring a goal before half time to make it 2-1 at the break.

Early in the second half, St Anne's snatched an equaliser and suddenly the game was back to all-square. However, Barrs Court found an extra gear and took the lead again with a screamer into the top corner. With time running out, St Anne's were awarded a penalty which they converted to make it 3-3 and take the game to extra time.

A quick team talk and the teams were back on. St Anne's scored after 30 seconds of the restart to take the lead for the first time. This was not the first time this season that we had found ourselves a goal behind with time running out and this experience allowed us to get back into the game again. The ball was pounced upon after a deflection to bring the scores back level at 4-4. Into the second half of extra time and Barrs Court decided that they did not want to rely on the lottery of penalties and a quick break ended in a goal to re-take the lead at 5-4. St Anne's threw everything they could at us in the search for an equaliser and Barrs Court were able to counter-attack and grab goal number 6 before the final whistle. What a match! A big message of respect to our opponents- they played extremely well and were fully deserving as cup finalists.

The whole experience was even more special as the crowd contained not only family members of the players but also a huge number of children from Barrs Court and their parents who wanted to support the team as well as ex-pupils and their parents who are still invested in our school experiences. Team Barrs Court goes far beyond the players on the pitch and we thank you for all of your support tonight (and the confetti, cake and silly string!)




