Safeguarding concern - Mobile phones

We sent a letter to Green Area parent and carers addressing a concern about the misuse of messaging apps, including WhatsApp, by children to send inappropriate messages. It has since been brought to our attention that this issue also involves children in Year 4 using various messaging apps to communicate in an unkind manner.

We strongly urge all parents and carers—especially those whose children own a phone, have access to a phone, or have an older sibling with a phone—to monitor the messages being sent and received by their children. This step is crucial in fostering a safe and respectful digital environment for all our children.

Building Work on school site

Next term, our school will undergo upgrades to enhance our environmental sustainabilit . We will be replacing our gas boilers with more eco-friendly heat pumps and updating all radiators throughout the building. As a result of these improvements, the staff car park will be closed to all vehicles for the duration of Term 4.

During this period, we kindly request that parents bringing their children to the breakfast club in the mornings use the main entrance. We are committed to ensuring that this construction work causes minimal disruption to our children's learning experience. To achieve this, any potential disturbances will be carefully managed and communicated to the children in advance.

Parking

The introduction of parking buddies has significantly enhanced the safety of the area surrounding our school, ensuring a safer environment for our children to cross the road. Each buddy represents a substantial investment of £200, aimed at safeguarding our children by creating safe crossing areas.
