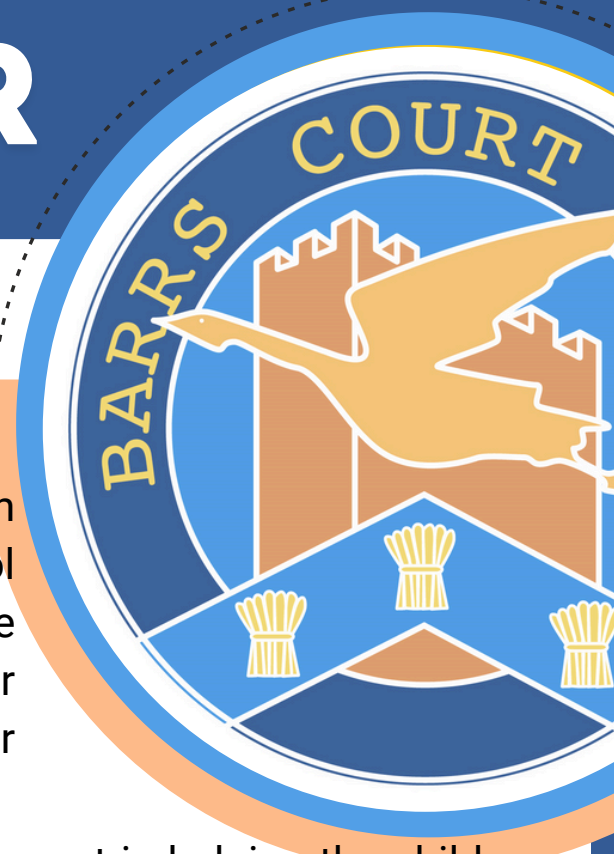

A Reminder About Parking and Road Safety

As the weather gets colder and wetter, we understand that more of our school community may need to drive to school, which can lead to increased congestion at drop-off and pick-up times.

If you do need to drive, please do not stop or park on the yellow zig-zag lines outside the school gates. These areas are there to keep the space clear and safe for children to cross.



We also ask that you park considerately and avoid stopping close to junctions. Parking near junctions significantly reduces visibility and makes it much more dangerous for children and families trying to cross the road.

There is free and accessible parking available in Asda, behind the curry house, and in designated on-street parking areas nearby. Thank you for helping us keep our children safe.

Footwear Reminder

We've had a few enquiries from parents and carers regarding school footwear, so we'd like to take this opportunity to clarify our expectations.

On PE days, children may wear trainers of any colour, but these should be sports trainers that provide proper support for physical activity. Fashion trainers, which are not designed for sport, are not suitable for PE.

On non-PE days, children should wear black shoes. These can be traditional black school shoes or plain black trainers, including branded ones. However, they must be completely black, with no coloured logos or soles. (Please see pictures below for examples.)

If your child would like to wear ankle boots, these should also be black. When buying ankle boots, please consider how easy they are for your child to take on and off independently as some styles, especially those with laces, can be tricky for younger children to manage during the school day.
