WEEKLY HOME LEARNING

Here are some ways that you can support your child with their learning at home. Below are a range of activities including Reading, Spelling, Maths tasks that can be completed weekly to practise key skills that children benefit from re-visiting regularly.

Online games and apps.

Spelling

Attached is a weekly grid of spellings that we'll be practising reading and writing in our daily phonics lessons.

Please practise reading and spelling these words at home to help consolidate your child's learning from this week.

Reading

Reading regularly with your child at home helps them to develop fluency and confidence applying their phonic knowledge.

Record your child's reading in their planner and we'll check Fivers weekly. We collect in reading books every Thursday and you get new books on a Friday.

Year 1 Maths Place value to 10

- Can you make a number line? You could use toys like dominoes or building blocks. Count forward and backwards. How far can you count?
- Go on a number hunt around your home. Where do you see numbers? Can you say the number? Can you write it in words?
- Practise adding and subtracting within 10. Take two sets of objects – Can you find the total?



Year 2 Maths Place value to 100

- Can you make a 100 square? Maybe you could turn it into a Snakes and Ladders game board!
- Represent a 2 digit number using objects that represent how many tens and ones.

Being a Scientist



Go on a material hunt.

In school we are going to learn about the properties and uses of materials (eg rough, flexible, hard, soft, waterproof).

Can you find and label materials around your home?
What could you make out of the materials that you find?

Being an Artist



Who wears a hat?

Can you find a book with a character who wears a hat? Why do they wear a hat?

Draw a picture of them. Can you add labels or sentences that describe them?

Being an Engineer



Design and/or make an item of clothing or accessory.

In school we will be designing and making a hat using drawing, cutting, measuring and attaching skills.

What item could you make?
What materials will you use?
Who is it designed for?
